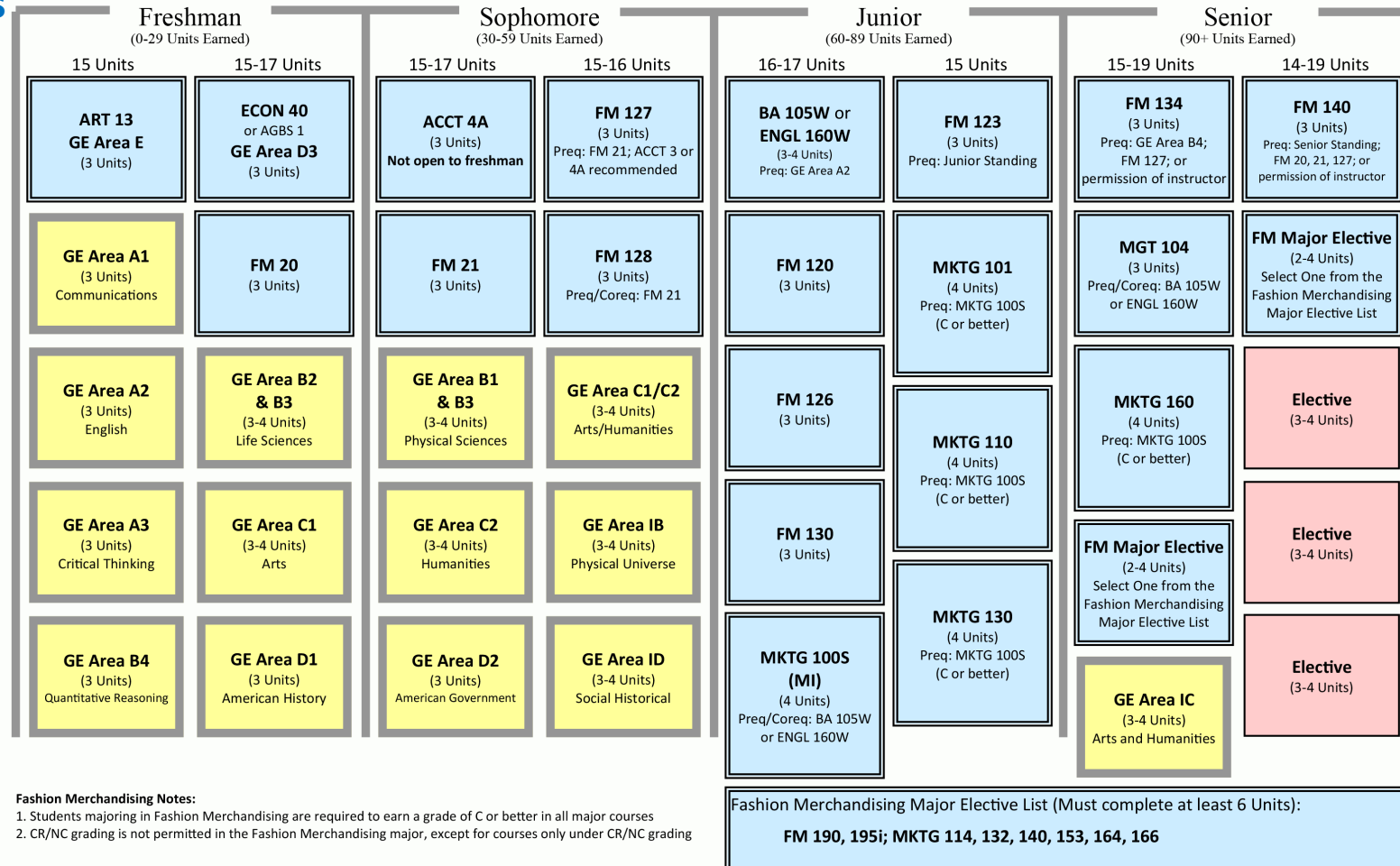
Fashion Merchandising Flowchart Catalog Year 2020-2021
